It feels like the 2012 elections are barely behind us and already we are planning for the 2014 elections. Candidates are free to set their own time tables for campaigns, depending on their strategies. Some decide to jump in early to raise money, lock in support or dispel rumors they may not run again. Others hold off until voters are beginning to consider the upcoming election.

In Florida, a person is a legal candidate when they file the form naming a campaign treasurer and the bank that will house their campaign checking account. Then they start the process of qualifying to have their name on the ballot. This requires filing with the local Supervisor of Elections before making campaign expenditures or accepting campaign contributions. While there is no legal start date, all candidates must fulfill the qualifying requirements before the qualifying period ends in June 2014.

Locally we have County Commission Districts 2 and 4 plus School Board Districts 1, 3 and 5 up for election in 2014. The Supervisor of Elections office is hosting a candidate workshop on March 13, 2014 at 9:00 a.m. Participants include Candidates, Campaign Treasurers, Campaign Managers, Consultants, Parties, the Media and all other interested parties.
