## ELECTION NEWS

Early voting is under way for the General Election. Early voting will take place at the Supervisor of Elections office from Monday, October 20<sup>th</sup> through Saturday, November 1<sup>st</sup>. (Including both Saturday and Sunday) Early voting will be open from 8:00 a.m. to 6:00 p.m. daily.

Early voters must bring identification (such as a Florida driver's license) that contains a photo and a signature. Other forms of ID can be found at <a href="www.votelevy.com">www.votelevy.com</a>. Voters who do not have proper identification will be required to vote a provisional ballot.

Samples ballots have been mailed to every active registered voter who has not requested a mail ballot for the upcoming election. Voters are encouraged to review their sample ballot and even bring it to the polls, with pre-determined choices marked, to expedite the voting process. Voters may also visit the Supervisor of Elections website to download a sample ballot.

Voters also have the option to request an absentee ballot to be mailed to them. Absentee ballots cannot be forwarded, so if you will not be at your Levy County address, you will need to provide, in writing, the address to which you want the ballot mailed. Requests for absentee ballots can be made at VoteLevy.com or by calling the Elections Office at (352) 486-5163. The deadline for voters to request an absentee ballot to be mailed to them is the close of business on Wednesday, October 29<sup>th</sup>.

Voters who choose to wait until Election Day to vote must go to their assigned polling location. Voters may confirm their polling location by clicking "Find Your Precinct" on the Supervisor of Elections website or by calling the Elections Office.

Save time by planning ahead. Voters may view voter turnout from the Elections Office homepage under "What's New".
