Voter Registration Statistics As of 08/29/2017




Every year, thousands of Americans find themselves unable to vote because they miss a registration deadline, fail to update their registration, or aren't sure how to register.

Cybersecurity Q&A

☆ Is my voter information secure against cyber attacks?

Information security is an important topic being discussed right now not only in the election world, but in all industries. Cyber attacks are a major issue and cause disturbances if systems are not properly equipped to prevent malicious activity. All information stored on our server has safeguards place to keep information secure against outside interference.

★ What steps are being taken to ensure that information stays safe?

Voter information is stored on a server behind a firewall which prevents access from unauthorized users. The server is located on a network that is monitored and maintained in real time by Supervisor of Elections staff.

★ Is it possible for a hacker to "hack" an election to change results?

No. There are many steps we take to ensure the integrity of the electoral process. Our tabulation system is not connected to internet and follows a strict chain of custody to prevent tampering.

☆ What information on a voter record is already publicly available?

Requests may be made by anyone and the following information must be publicly available as supplied on registration applications: name, address, date of birth, mailing address, party affiliation, email/telephone number if supplied, and voting history.
