Election Day is right around the corner. As we prepare, I often reflect on how thankful I am to each and every poll worker and our community partners who assist in keeping “democracy” alive and well in Levy County. Many thanks for all you do!

With the presidential contest in play, the Elections office is preparing for an overall 80% turnout in November. In addition to the President of the United States, your Congressional, Senate, judicial retention and 4 constitutional amendments will be included on your ballot. You will not see any county races on your ballot as they were decided in the August Primary Election.

Election Reminders:

- ☆ Click on the “Check My Voter Status” tab at www.votelevy.com to check your individual voter status. This is the best way to check your record to ensure all information is up to date.
- ☆ If you have moved recently, please update your address online under “What’s New.” Click on “Need to Change Address” and fill in the required information. You may call 352-486-5163 or visit the Elections office at 421 S. Court St., Bronson.
- ☆ Keep your signature up to date. You can download the form from the website, update your signature and hand-deliver or mail it to the Elections office.
- ☆ Remember: A vote by mail ballot counts the same as one cast at your precinct - as long as it arrives at the Elections office by 7 p.m. Election Day. You no longer need to cite a reason to receive one. Simply contact the Elections office and request a ballot, which is mailed approximately a month before the election. You can track your ballot at www.VoteLevy.com, to find out when it is received.
- ☆ To learn more about the 4 constitutional amendments you can view the full text version under “What’s New.” Click on “View Proposed Constitutional Amendment.” If you do not have computer access you may stop by our office to pick up a copy or call us and we will mail you one.

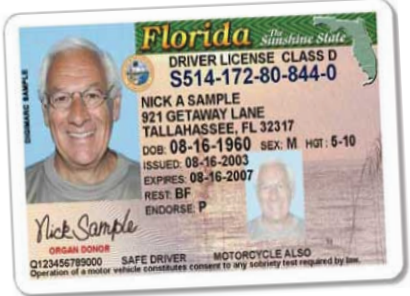

<div>Rights of Electricity Consumers Regarding Solar Energy Choice</div> <div>This amendment establishes a right under Florida's constitution for consumers to own or lease solar equipment installed on their property to generate electricity for their own use. State and local governments shall retain their abilities to protect consumer rights and public health, safety and welfare, and to ensure that consumers who do not choose to install solar are not required to subsidize the costs of backup power and electric grid access to those who do.</div> <div>The amendment is not expected to result in an increase or decrease in any revenues or costs to state and local government.</div> <div><div><input type="radio"/> YES</div><div><input type="radio"/> NO</div></div>	<div>Use of Marijuana for Debilitating Medical Conditions</div> <div>Allows medical use of marijuana for individuals with debilitating medical conditions as determined by a licensed Florida physician. Allows caregivers to assist patients' medical use of marijuana. The Department of Health shall register and regulate centers that produce and distribute marijuana for medical purposes and shall issue identification cards to patients and caregivers. Applies only to Florida law. Does not immunize violations of federal law or any non-medical use, possession or production of marijuana.</div> <div>Increased costs from this amendment to state and local governments cannot be determined. There will be additional regulatory costs and enforcement activities associated with the production, sale, use and possession of medical marijuana. Fees may offset some of the regulatory costs. Sales tax will likely apply to most purchases, resulting in a substantial increase in state and local government revenues that cannot be determined precisely. The impact on property tax revenues cannot be determined.</div> <div><div><input type="radio"/> YES</div><div><input type="radio"/> NO</div></div>	<div>Tax Exemption for Totally and Permanently Disabled First Responders</div> <div>Proposing an amendment to the State Constitution to authorize a first responder, who is totally and permanently disabled as a result of injuries sustained in the line of duty, to receive relief from ad valorem taxes assessed on homestead property, if authorized by general law. 		<div>NO. 5 CONSTITUTIONAL AMENDMENT ARTICLE VII, SECTION 6 ARTICLE XII</div> <div>Homestead Tax Exemption for Certain Senior, Low-Income, Long-Term Residents; Determination of Just Value</div> <div>Proposing an amendment to the State Constitution to revise the homestead tax exemption that may be granted by counties or municipalities for property with just value less than \$250,000 owned by certain senior, low-income, long-term residents to specify that just value is determined in the first tax year the owner applies and is eligible for the exemption. Show Your ID
Florida Law requires each voter to present both photo and signature identification at the polls:

- ☆ Florida Driver's License
- ☆ Florida ID Card issued by the Department of Highway Safety and Motor Vehicles
- ☆ United States Passport
- ☆ Debit or Credit Card
- ☆ Military ID
- ☆ Student ID
- ☆ Retirement Center ID
- ☆ Neighborhood Association ID
- ☆ Public Assistance ID
- ☆ Veteran Health ID
- ☆ Florida Concealed Weapon ID
- ☆ Employee ID issued by the Federal Government, the state, a county, or a municipality

SAMPLE BALLOT TIPS:

Use your sample ballot to help expedite voting at the polls. Mark the sample ballot at home, then take it with you to the polls so you can quickly copy your choices onto your official ballot.

Remember, this is only a sample ballot, not an actual ballot. DO NOT return this sample ballot to the Supervisor of Elections office. To request an official mail ballot, contact the office at 352-486-5163.

This sample ballot is voter specific. It is ONLY correct for the person named on the address portion of this newsletter.
