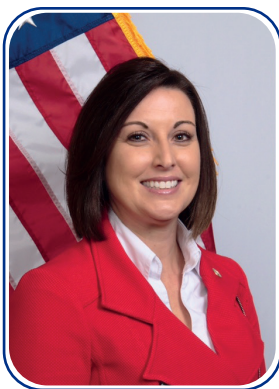

As the 2018 election cycle quickly approaches, each citizen eighteen years of age or older, has been empowered with the right to participate in the democratic process. Voting has never been easier than it is today. My staff and I are diligently working to encourage citizens to keep democracy alive and well in Levy County.

I urge all Levy County voters to take a moment to verify that all of their information is current and up-to-date. Please notify my office if your address, name, or signature has changed. Voter drives will be held throughout the county to accommodate voters who need to update their information.

Our growing Vote By Mail program helps reduce voter traffic at the polling place on Election Day. Any eligible and registered voter in Levy County may choose to vote by mail, no reason is required. These ballots (also known as Absentee Ballots) are counted in the State of Florida during every election and are among the first results available at 7:00 p.m. on Election night. Complete the enclosed postcard to request a Vote By Mail ballot. The card can be returned to the Elections Office by mail or in person.

TRACK YOUR BALLOT

TRACK THE STATUS OF YOUR VOTE-BY-MAIL BALLOT AT:

www.votelevy.com

Click on the "VOTE-BY-MAIL" icon, Then choose the "Track your Vote by Mail (Absentee) Ballot" option.

If you are already scheduled for any future elections, the track-your-ballot feature will indicate the elections in which you are scheduled to receive ballots and to what address those ballots will be delivered.

Once you return your ballot, you can track the delivery of your ballot to make sure your ballot was received by the Supervisor of Elections.

SIGNATURE UPDATE

Your signature is important!

When you vote by mail, the signature on your ballot certificate envelope is compared to the signature on your voter record.

Do you need to update your signature with the Supervisor of Elections Office?

How: Use a Florida Voter Registration Application form.

When: At any point there is a significant change in your signature or identifying "mark."

Where: Florida Voter Registration Application forms are available at your local library, or upon request by calling or emailing our office, or visiting our website.

If you have moved recently, please update your address online under "Register to Vote" tab, call 352-486-5163 or visit the Elections Office at 421 S Court St., Bronson.

VOTE BY MAIL INFORMATION

Vote By Mail ballots are NOT forwarded by the US Postal Service. You must provide an accurate mailing address at the time of your request. A mail ballot request to an address other than the elector's address on file, must be submitted in WRITING and SIGNED by the voter. A Vote By Mail request is not permanent. State law allows for a request placed now to be valid through the end of 2020. Use the Vote By Mail Ballot Request Card included on the previous page of this publication to make your request, or call the office at (352) 486-5163 to request a ballot by phone.

Vote By Mail ballots must be received in the Elections Office by 7:00 p.m. on Election Day. If mailing your voted ballot, please mail by WEDNESDAY BEFORE ELECTION DAY to allow for first-class delivery by the US Postal Service. Certain provisions are made by law for the delivery and return of mail ballots for uniformed service members, their spouses and dependents, and U.S. citizens residing overseas. Mail ballots may also be personally returned to the Elections Office during business hours, or anytime by using the secured After Hours Drop Box located by the main entrance of the Supervisor of Elections office.

FLORIDA HOLDS CLOSED PRIMARY ELECTIONS

Florida is a Closed Primary State. If you wish to vote for a candidate seeking a partisan office in a Primary Election, you must be a registered voter in the party for which the Primary is being held.

All registered voters, regardless of party affiliation, may vote on issues and nonpartisan candidates in a Primary Election. This is why it is important to indicate your preferred party affiliation at the time you register to vote. If you leave the field blank on the registration form, you will be registered without party affiliation (NPA on your Voter Information Card).

Registered voters with no party affiliation may vote in the following races appearing on a Primary Election ballot:

- Nonpartisan judicial, school board and city offices
- Local referendum questions
- A contest in which all candidates for an office have the same party affiliation and the winner of that contest will have no opposition in the General Election (this is known as a Universal Primary Contest)

Nonpartisan races could be decided in a Primary Election.
