

How Do I Return my Ballot?

You can return your ballot by:

- Mail;
- Or in person at the Supervisor of Elections.

Voters will need to place their ballot into the enclosed secrecy envelope, and then insert the secrecy envelope into the enclosed mailing envelope which is addressed to the Supervisor. Once you've sealed the return envelope, please remember to sign and date the back of the envelope.



Note: Signatures change over time due to aging or medical conditions. Now is the time to make sure an update signature is on file by completing a Voter Registration Application.

Dates to Remember

Primary Election

July 14, 2018: Last day to mail ballots to Military and Overseas voters.

July 24, 2018: Initial Vote by Mail ballots will be mailed to voters.

August 22, 2018: Last day to receive requests for Vote by Mail ballots to be mailed.

August 28, 2018: Election Day (ballots must be to our office by 7 PM).

General Election

September 22, 2018: Last day to mail ballots to Military and Overseas voters.

October 2, 2018: Initial Vote by Mail ballots will be mailed to voters.

October 31, 2018: Last day to receive requests for Vote by Mail ballots to be mailed.

November 6, 2018: Election Day (ballots must be to our office by 7 PM).

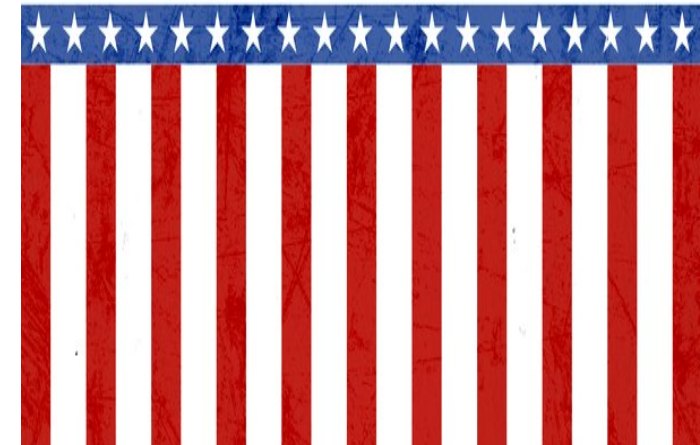
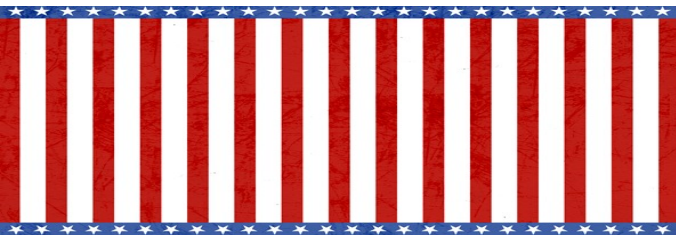
Vote by Mail Voting Guide

Who Can Vote by Mail?

Any qualified registered Levy County voter is entitled to vote a Vote by Mail ballot.

How to Request a Vote by Mail Ballot

A Vote by Mail ballot can be requested by a voter in:

- Person: At our office;
- Telephone: (352)486-5163;
- Fax: (352)486-5146;
- Or online: www.votelevy.com.

Voters can instruct an immediate family member or legal guardian to request a Vote by Mail ballot for them.

Immediate family can be defined as the voter's spouse, parent, child, grandparent, or sibling of the voter or the voter's spouse.

Note: A request for a Vote by Mail ballot to be mailed to an address other than the one on file must be in writing and signed by the voter.

Submitting Your Request

When submitting your request for a ballot, please remember to include:

- The name of the voter for whom the ballot is requested.
- The voter's address.
- The voter's date of birth.
- The voter's signature.

Note: Ballots cannot be forwarded - voter should provide current address.

Specific Election VS. All Elections

A Vote by Mail ballot may be requested for a specific election or for all elections through the next two regularly scheduled general elections.



When Will I Receive my Ballot?

Ballots are mailed within two (2) business days after receiving your request.

Can I Pick Up my Ballot?

A voter may pick up their ballot once the Supervisor of Elections has printed and made your ballot available. You have until the day before the election to pick up your ballot.

Starting five (5) days prior to the day of election, any voter may designate in writing a person to pick up their ballot. The designee has to provide written authorization from the voter and picture identification.

IMPORTANT!!

Voters can only pick - up a ballot on Election Day if there is an EMERGENCY, to the extent that the elector will be unable to go to his or her assigned polling place.
